They are our music leaders so music has suffered in the church with some of us trying to do the best we can with our limited knowledge and talent for music. I told everyone I would be glad to sing and they said if I did they would stay home and watch it on the internet where they can turn the volume off.

We are now trying to get a couple of other projects started. We had started building a handicapped accessible bathroom but that stopped when the virus came to town. Hopefully we can get that going again. Also our concrete front steps are crumbling and we had finally got the go ahead on starting replacing them but it has been hard to find someone to do it. We have the money to do both of these projects but we can't seem to get it started. Spring has arrived and everyone is busy with cleaning up from the winter and doing projects at home. With 8 or 9 months of winter I guess I can understand. We will get it done soon though. I wish I had more to report but as I said things were kind of slow. We are hanging in there though and are still looking for the soon return of our Lord. Thank you for all you do for us and may the lord bless you all.
