Although it has been a severe hurricane season, it has brought the most rain we have seen since arriving here. Fields are actually producing crops and the temperatures have been more pleasant. The air has been fresher, and things are green and blooming again.

Here On The Ground

Unfortunately, not everything has gone so well. The left- and right-wing guerrillas are still at work terrorizing, kidnapping, and killing. The left-wing guerrillas have burned farm equipment and attacked police stations. Crime has increased with murders, rapes, and gangs on motorcycles making the streets rather unsafe at times. Needless to say, domestic violence has increased as well. Also, businesses continue to leave Valledupar. Malls are empty and entire sectors of downtown have closed.

Church Situation

Although the government seems to allow the Churches to open, there are really too many restrictions at this time. Brother Simeon continues to help me, but his time has been very limited. Due to the problems in health care, he has been working twelve or more hours per day. He asks prayer for his situation that he can do more in the Church. We ask that you help us pray for the Venezuelan family of Brother Willesme. Finally, they were able to get Internet. Also, there have been some interested in the Church. Please pray that we can win the ones that are lost for the Lord.

Smaller Difficulties

Thank the Lord, I was able to renew my ID card. A motorcycle hit our car just as driving restrictions were lifted at the first of October. I was so thankful that the man on the motorcycle was unhurt. Please pray that the Lord keep us save on the roads as we travel and help us to deal with that.

Our Household

Thank the Lord, Hannah and Timothy are doing well in home school. Hannah helps her aunt with a virtual Sunday School class. A few from Valledupar are participating. Please continue to pray for our general safety and health as well. We have not been able to travel to Bogotá to get some important checkups done.

We trust that the Lord make Himself known even more to you as you grow in these times when we need to trust Him more and more.
