- Noah is doing well at school at PCC this semester. He is getting into the groove of college life and is doing well. We are so proud of him as well.

- Luke is doing well. He is missing his brothers, but is working hard trying to finish up his high school classes in order to graduate in May. We can't believe we will be empty nesters in just a few months, as he will be heading off to Crown College. It's kind of hard to swallow. Amanda asks for your prayers as she will be stuck with just me to talk to at home. LOL

MINISTRY NEWS: It has been a real roller coaster these past two and half months. The government put us in lock down again over the holidays and into January, which required us to go back to full ZOOM church services. They even implemented a curfew from 8pm to 5 am with hefty fines for breaking the law being out during those hours. They allowed us back to church on the 24th of January with only 10 people allowed in attendance. This has been actually much more difficult to manage. We have started 4 services on Sunday to accommodate most of our people. We still have several families, remaining at home and following our zoom services due to concerns for their health. It has been hard, but at the same time, God has been so good! We have had some first time visitors lately. Praise the Lord.

This coming April, we are losing 3 families, due to health and personal reasons. Our deacon and his family, who have been a big part of our ministry here for almost 7 years, are moving back to the States. 2 other of our faithful elderly couples are moving to another town about 2 hours from us, due to health issues. They will be living with or near their children during the waning years of their lives. It hit our church people pretty hard, as all three families will be moving around the same time. But again, God is good, already He has led two other solid Christian families to move to our town and will be attending our church starting this Summer and Fall (the Lord willing). So that was encouraging to our people. So please help us pray for them as they move.

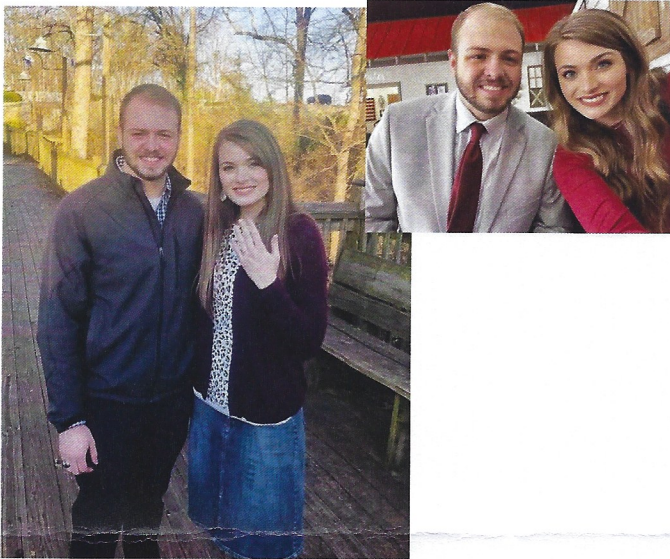

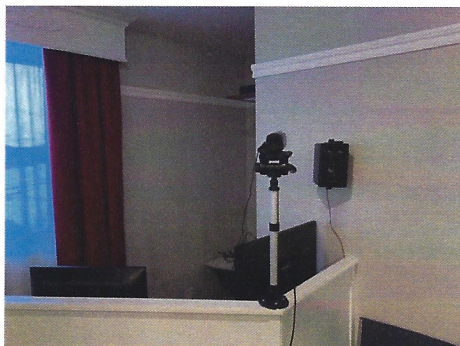

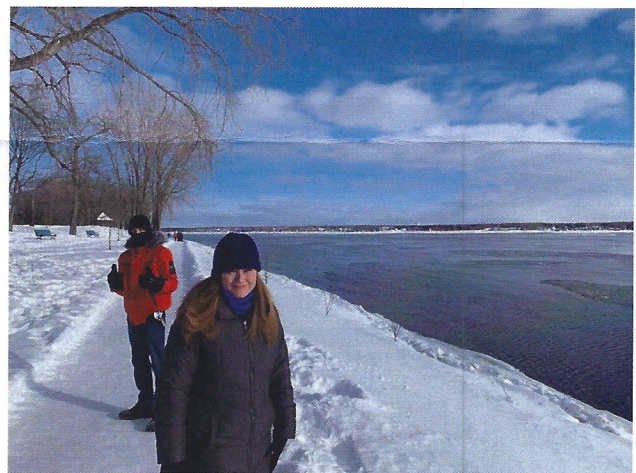
Our camera setup for Zoom Church
