He pastors a small church in Darby, Montana and we just wanted to be an encouragement to them. Our next travels took us over the mountain to Orofina, Idaho to be at Clear Water Baptist Church. We were able to have some fellowship with Brother Danny and Sister Renae Vaughn and their family. Then it was time to go on to Colfax, Washington to spend time with Brother Tim and Sister Jennifer Wall and their family at Macedonia Baptist Church. I have a temporary splint type cast on my foot and ankle. I could not get in and out of the camper. A couple that attends Brother Wall's church took us in for the three weeks. Brother Wall took us back and forth to the doctor usually twice a week. This week on Wednesday with help we made it to Buffalo, Wyoming. Our plans are to leave here with help to make it back to Georgia by weekend. Once back in Georgia I will see the orthopedic doctor there for continuing care.

They are faced with many problems stemming from Covid-19 just as are churches in the east. For this reason it is hard to cancel my meetings.
