Dear Prayer Warriors,

Greetings in the matchless name of our wonderful Lord and Saviour, Jesus Christ. I pray this letter finds you well and greatly rejoicing in God's great love and amazing grace! Anita and I are doing well. We continually give God thanks and praise for each of you. We are so thankful for your faithful, financial and prayerful support. Thank you for standing with our family as we have entered our 34th year of serving God with Macedonia World Baptist Missions. Please forgive the tardiness of this prayer letter as time simply slipped by faster than I realized!

I praise God for the open doors to preach and present the cause of world-wide-missions. It has been a great joy to see God save souls and to see many people in the altar praying as God moved them. I am always humbled when I see God working in hearts and lives as I have the joy of preaching His Word.

I am sure you are aware of the extreme danger that exist in Haiti, both for Haitians and foreigners. This danger did not just surface on October 16th when 16 Americans and one Canadian were kidnapped and being held for 17 million dollars ransom. The rise in crime and kidnappings has been escalating with extreme malice over the last two years. There are many missionaries still in Haiti who are hazarding their lives for the furtherance of the Gospel of Jesus Christ. Please continue to pray for Connie Anderson and the work she has in a remote mountain top area. Even in the remoteness of her location, there exist gangs that cause great havoc and disrupt people's daily lives and present a risk of danger.

I communicate with Connie Anderson several times a week and I can report that they are doing well as they experience the protecting and providing hand of God. The price of gasoline in their area of Haiti has at times risen to \$60 US\$ a gallon when it can be found. Solar panels help provide limited electricity during the day, but at night they depend heavily on diesel fuel to operate the generator to run the washing machine. They need gasoline for the four-wheeler to get groceries and fuel for the generator up the mountain. While Ms. Connie never complains, I can assure she stands in need of your prayers. The cost of food items and everyday necessities has risen immensely. Please pray they can find the needed food and supplies at prices they can afford.

Anita and I pray that you experience a warm and family-filled Thanksgiving.
