Then, unexpectedly, all *our* plans came to a stop. Nathaniel Bergey, "Thanny," Brent and Selina's 17- year-old son, became sick and needed an emergency surgery. Shortly after, Thanny was diagnosed with Stage 4 Lymphoma. Within that same week, he and his mom boarded a plane and flew back to the States to begin his chemo treatment. Though our world is left spinning, we have found that God's grace is truly sufficient for each moment. Please pray for strength and grace as the Bergey family walks this valley together. Pray for Mrs. Bergey, as she is separated from her husband and other babies while caring for her son. Pray for much courage for Thanny, as he continues to face this difficult journey. It has been such an encouragement to watch this family praise the Lord even through the darkest of days. God is always, only good.

Though life looks different, ministry has *not* stopped. Pastor Brent is faithfully leading Abundant Life Baptist Church and ministries here, while his wife and son are miles away. It has been wonderful to see our church family rally together in the unity of seeing God get the glory through it all. Ellie, the Bergey's eldest daughter, has taken over the responsibilities of homeschooling her siblings and keeping their hearts physically and emotionally stable. Pray for them as they carry a lot on their shoulders.

Meanwhile, in my cottage, Little "P" and "A" are continuing to grow and thrive. In the midst of navigating these new waves around us, God added a tiny little fish to our ministry. Though my world has changed completely (and my eyes are slightly baggier in the morning), my heart is overwhelmed with love for this sweet baby boy. We are humbled that God allowed us the opportunity to love on this precious child. God is still working.

It is a privilege to serve God through the mountains and valleys.

He will never fail us.

His way is perfect.
