Shopping presents its own difficulties as you search for items that are named something completely different than you have ever known. You may be searching for jelly, and it is called jam here. Jelly is considered gelatin, not quite the same thing you are wanting. Not significant, but enough to make grocery shopping more of an event than a simple errand. Many items are even pre-paid (like electric). We have learned (the hard way) that if you do not check the amount of electricity you currently have, you might be in the dark until a store opens where you can purchase more. Going to the grocery store to buy electricity is also a new experience. These are not insurmountable challenges, but they require patience for us to adapt to them.

June and July have been filled with a lot of excitement and changes. One huge area of excitement for us was serving in Abundant Life Baptist Church. Our first two Sundays were wonderful as we met many new people and experienced God moving through the singing and preaching. God used this time to confirm in our hearts that this was precisely where we were meant to be. The following month brought about some different changes. Pastor Brent went to the U.S. to spend time with his family. Since March, the Bergey's had been on two different continents with their oldest son, Nathaniel, going through surgery, chemotherapy, and now recovery in the U.S. While the Bergey's spent some much-needed time together, Pastor Brent allowed Matthew the opportunity to preach and fill in at Abundant Life.
