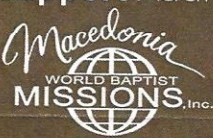

I want to begin by thanking every church and individual for your prayers and support. God has been so good to our family.

Deborah and the boys are doing well. Homeschooling on the road has been interesting for the boys as they are getting into higher grades. We were able to take a few short breaks on the road and see Sea World and the Alamo as well as the Ark exhibit. It has been a very difficult realization that as Joseph has turned 15 now this will be his last term with us on the mission field. We are trying to do several things as a family that we could make memories with the boys other than just the mission field.

We have been on furlough since March and have traveled in NY, TX, MD, VA, NC, TN, GA, SC, and FL. God has allowed us to preach and encourage many of our supporters. It has been difficult as we were on a shorter furlough and didn't get to see as many as we wanted to. God has allowed us into some new churches, and I didn't understand why. I have spoken to our friends and current missionary partners on the mission field, the Kenneys, and they tell me that inflation is out of hand in Ghana. Pray for Ghana as our people are suffering from the inflation increase. When we arrived in Ghana, the exchange was 2 Ghana cedes to 1 dollar. It is now 14 to 1 which makes everything much more expensive. Our people in Ghana are facing serious struggles to eat and to live.

Pray for the Ghanaian people; their spiritual needs far exceed their physical needs. Our people have churches everywhere, but if the pastors don't know the gospel, then it is dead religion that is substituted for truth. Pray for our church people and pray for a young man named Emanuel that God would really work on his heart. Pray also for all of our people in the church that God would convict them and that they would grow in the grace of God. Pray also that God would call some of our boys into the ministry. We will not have anyone to take our furlough next term so I have no idea how long this term will be.

Pray also for us as we get ready to head back to Ghana at the end of January. Pray for our plane tickets and that we will be able to get everything done that we need. I will need gallbladder surgery, I think, before we fly as well as physicals for Deborah and I. We will also need to see the dentist before we leave. January will be dedicated to getting us ready physically and mentally for the return to the field and to the ministry God has called us to. Pray for the radio ministry as well as the land we are trying to gain possession of soon after I arrive so that we can hopefully build a small church building and get out of our current location.

I know that many describe missionaries as heroes; they aren't. Missionaries are people that are doing what God has given them to do. Obedience and faithfulness are what God rewards not the place or position of one's calling.
