Hope all is well in your neck of the woods. Thank you so much for all the Christmas and birthday cards and gifts. Y'all are a blessing and very generous to us! We have completed our furlough and are in the final stages of preparing to return to Taiwan! All our tickets and travel arrangements are set and we are excited to return and get to work. We were able to successfully extend our Resident Visas for 6 months and will be able to renew them for the full year once we get back.

I realize we are behind on getting out this letter. For over a month now all of us in the family have been sick off and on with more days sick than not. We don't want to see the devil in everything and take everything as some sort of attack, but we love our church and being in church and have a short time to enjoy it before we leave. For Kelsie, not having access to nursery and still being in the language learning stage means not being able to really be part of any service on the field. Our kids have little kid classes to be a part of. Logan, coughing and with a high fever has said so sweetly, "But I won't cough on anyone!" He loves church. And yet, like clock work, we will finally be well the night before church, but come a church day, at least one person has a high fever, or vomiting, or pink-eye, or the like seemingly out of nowhere. It's suspicious when a child keeps having a 104 fever for several weeks with only a few breaks in the mix. But the doctors didn't think there were other issues involved, just coincidence. But, it's *that* season, and this year has been a crazy flu season anyway. All this to say we are excited to be heading back, but whether coincidence or not, we are aware that we have an enemy that would love to throw a wrench in things or cause discouragement. Our spirits are fine though and we are ready to work. Please pray for our health as we finish packing and enjoy our final week before saying goodbye to family and heading out.

My wife will get the chance to go to a Lady's Retreat right before leave. She will get back Saturday night, we will have our last service that Sunday, and then we leave the next day on Monday. My parents will leave to go on furlough 2 weeks after we get back. While they are gone, we will watch their two churches - Mountaintop in Kaohsiung County, and the new church in Neipu, near where we live. The Neipu church will be adding a Sunday Morning service. We are also eager to resume efforts to see a Bible study started among the Paiwan people in Piuma village. Kelsie will return to her language lessons, and now that covid restrictions are continuing to loosen up, I hope to return to Paiwan language learning. We hope to continue to have good reports to share from the field in the following months. Please pray with us that God would work in our life and ministry as we begin our second term in Taiwan!
