Building in Peru

The security wall around the playground is almost finished. We have been waiting for the metal fencing for the front and back sections. I am

excited to be able to start building the first classroom building. I have \$18,000 of the estimated \$60,000 needed for the classroom building. God has provided so much over the last two years, and I know He has a plan to provide for this step in the building also. Please pray for wisdom as we go forward in building a Christian school for God's glory.

You may have heard about some political unrest in Peru lately. Praise the Lord, this has calmed down greatly and is mostly centered in the Puno region of the country now. We are now able to get some of the construction supplies that we had been waiting for but that had been blockaded by the riots.

Health update

I am continuing cancer treatments in Florida. My surgery at the end of September was very successful, and I have completed an intense series of radiation treatments. My blood markers for cancer are now in the normal range, but I did recently have a fluid build up in my abdomen that still contained some cancer cells. My oncologist wants to continue chemotherapy treatments at least into April, and then if there are no more signs of cancer I will be considered to be in remission and cleared to go back to Peru. Please pray for God's wisdom and timing as I desire to get back to the field as soon as possible; however, I also understand the need to treat the cancer completely. I am so thankful that Pastor Henry Sucapuca has been able to lead the building project in my absence. There are also church members who have stepped up to fill my shoes with many of the ministries I had to leave during this time. Please pray that the ministries in Peru will continue to grow and thrive in my absence.
