Dear Co-Laborers in Christ,

These are good families, and they would be a blessing to your church. I am also asking prayers for all the church planters in the Northwest as they have been through a hard winter and some will face severe flooding as the snow starts melting.

Now, I will update you on Sister Hutchens and myself. When I sent my last prayer letter she was having a heart ablation. She was sent home afterwards but had to return to the hospital and was admitted for 6 days. The ablation revealed that her natural pacemaker is weak and that she would have to have a pacemaker, but her heart needed to heal from the ablation first. During her healing time, on February 6, I had my permanent back spinal stimulator implant. It is helping my pain but will take some time to get the right level of stimulation figured out. Then on February 20, she had her pacemaker implanted. She is being monitored to make sure that the pacemaker takes care of all the heart issues. We are both on the mend for now. We do praise The Lord for how He has brought us through all this. We are making plans for our summer travels.

We just want to say thank you for your prayers and financial support. We truly appreciate each and every one of you. God bless as you serve Him.
