Thank you all for your continued prayers and support. The last few months have been one of the most challenging times for us since we arrived in Quebec. But because of your prayers and the grace of God that is sufficient for our needs, we have been given the strength to persevere. We see God's hand at work to direct us and instruct us in many ways.



In the church we have continued to see numerical growth. We saw our highest Sunday attendance of 65 people. We also had two men that were baptized, William and Jean. It was encouraging to see

their families present to witness this important moment in their walk with the Lord. Pray for these men that they will continue to grow in grace and be a light to others, especially to their family members.

A young couple attended one of our Wednesday night prayer meetings in February. They had just moved into the area and the lady was sincerely seeking God. Over the next few weeks I was able to meet with them to answer their questions and show them the plan of salvation. Both of them have now accepted Christ as their Savior and want to follow the Lord in baptism.

Due to unforeseen circumstances, they have had to move already to a different town. Please pray for Katiana and Dylan, that they will be able to get involved in a good church and continue to grow in their faith. We also have a new family that has recently immigrated from Haiti. Please pray for them as they get established here in Quebec City.

The Bible Institute classes are going well. We have eight students taking the New Testament Survey course. I am very thankful for the help of my friend Pastor Guillaume Roy that is teaching the course. Pray for the students to be encouraged and equipped.

This last winter was a mild one in terms of temperature, but it has been a hard one for our family. For the last few months, Sarah's health has not been good. The dark winter months are already difficult, but also Denver's difficulty sleeping at night along with the various illnesses and the constant demands of ministry and homeschooling have taken their toll lately on the family.

In March we took a trip down south to rest and recuperate. The time away was helpful and necessary to give us time to seek the Lord's strength and guidance. God used this time to speak to us and to help us understand the challenges we have been facing and especially how to discuss with our children the effects of loneliness and discouragement that we often face on the mission field.



God walks with us through the valleys, and when we're weak, that's when He shows himself strong. I have been reminded lately that the enemy is a persistent and powerful foe, but our God is greater and will sustain us. We ask you to fight with us in prayer. Pray that we can stay encouraged in the Lord and minister effectively here. Pray also that God will send more laborers to this field, especially to help us as the ministry grows. Pray also for Ashlyn as she finishes school and prepares for college. We appreciate you all and pray God will bless you richly!
