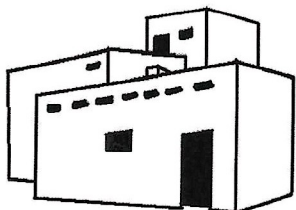

One such call required a gallon of gasoline and a hour round trip to help a family stranded along the road side. You have opportunity to counsel numerous times during each month. Other ministers and missionaries often call needing advice, not to mention church members with all sorts of things they need help with. From time to time there are hospital visits, visits to the prison, weddings and funerals, baby dedications and a myriad of other things to be done. We have discipleship classes each week and messages recorded and posted on the internet. These are just some of the things that we as missionaries do on a weekly basis. Ministry is work hard work, but that's exactly what we came here to do, Amen!

Thank you all so much for your faithful prayers and support of the ministry the Lord has called us to. We love you and praise the Lord for you! Thank you for allowing us to be your missionaries to Nuevo México. Lord bless you as we labor for souls!
