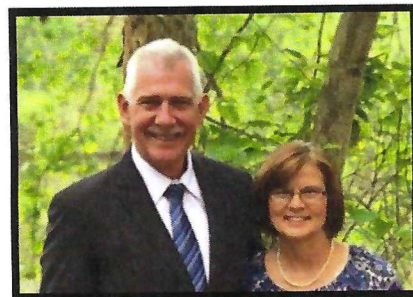

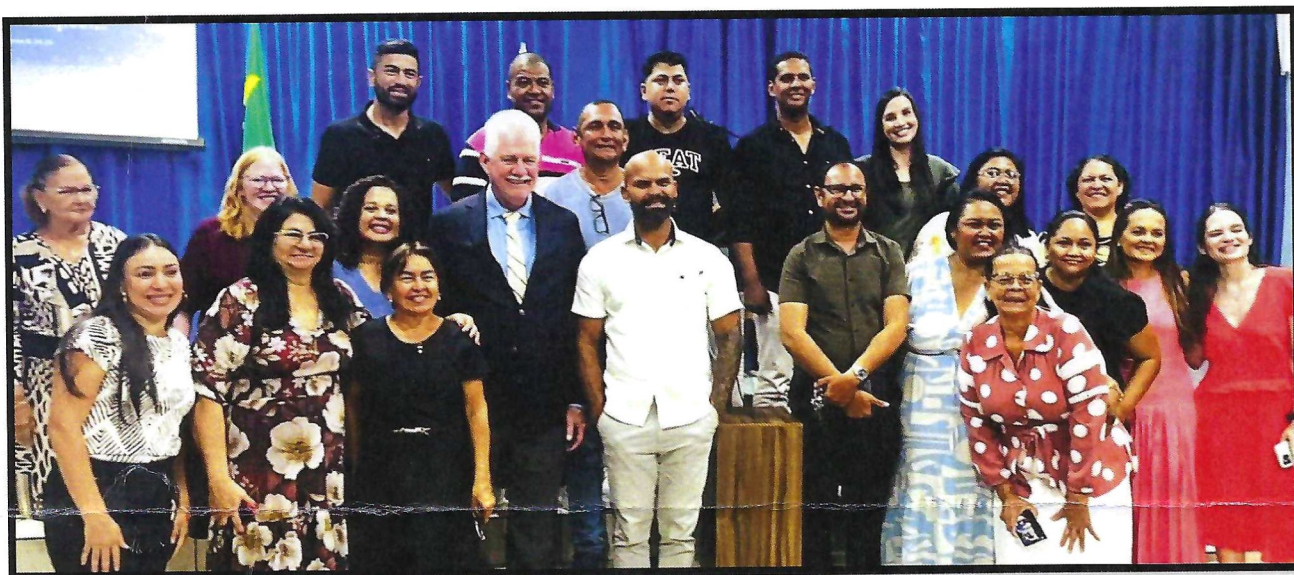


PRAYER LETTER – July 2025
