Dear Partners and Praying Friends,

I hope this letter finds you well in the Lord. We thank Him for each of you and for the vital part you play in helping us fulfill the mission God has given us. Every day we are reminded that we could not do this work without your faithful support.

Since our last update, our deputation travels have taken us to fifteen churches, where I was able to preach and present the ministry. Four of those churches have taken us on for support, and several others expect to present us to their congregations in the coming months. We praise the Lord for new partners and the many wonderful friends we have met along the way. God's people truly are the best people.

In September, I had the opportunity to travel with veteran missionary Bro. Wesley Hutchens to Jamaica, where he and his wife served faithfully for over twenty years. We visited several churches he started, and I preached a three-day revival as well as the anniversary service at Heritage Independent Baptist Church in Spanish Town. It was a blessing to meet so many people the Hutchens family had reached and discipled throughout their ministry.

In early November, missionary Jeremiah Horton asked us to come to Honduras to repair a church bus for a missionary there. My friend Bro. Dustin Penland and I flew in on the 4th and immediately began working. We were able to complete the repairs by Wednesday evening, just in time for church, where I also preached, and the bus was put to use that very night. Although we were only in Honduras for forty-eight hours, God strengthened us to accomplish what was needed for the ministry in Santa Barbara. We praise Him for that.

While I was in Honduras, Deanna and the children prepared for our big trip for the following week. On November 12th, we flew from Atlanta to St. Vincent to work alongside the David Ballinger family with "The Every Village Project." We thank the Lord for safe travels and smooth flights. We will remain here until December 22nd as we labor with them to reach the people of St. Vincent with the gospel.

Since arriving, we have celebrated Braylen's 15th birthday, and next week we will celebrate Malachi Ballinger's birthday. Missionaries often spend holidays and birthdays away from

extended family and close friends; so we are grateful to share this season with dear friends. We also plan to prepare a traditional American Thanksgiving meal to share with several local pastors so they can experience it for the first time.

Please continue to pray as we work alongside the Ballinger family over the next several weeks. Our desire is to reach as many villages as possible by preaching, distributing tracts, holding Bible studies, conducting street meetings, and helping lighten the load of the faithful workers here in St. Vincent and the Grenadines.

These past few months have brought numerous opportunities to serve. We spent two weeks in Georgia assisting a ministry by working in their warehouse and completing needed mechanical repairs on several ministry vehicles. By doing the work ourselves, we were able to save the ministry thousands of dollars. We praise the Lord for allowing us to help so practically.

For a week in October we were able to spend time with a missionary family while the husband was away on a missions trip to Israel. This visit came at a crucial time, as he had recently received a cancer diagnosis. Deanna was able to encourage his wife, and our children were a blessing to theirs. During our stay, I completed several projects around their home so our brother wouldn't have to face them upon his return. We praise God that he has since undergone surgery, and doctors believe all the cancer was removed. With additional natural treatments, they expect a full recovery. Through this time God showed us why He kept our calendar open for that time. We love to see God work like He does.

We continue to be humbled by the doors God opens for our family. As we mentioned in our last prayer letter, we plan to go to Alaska at the beginning of next year. Due to lodging we have changed the dates to February though. Praise the Lord we have found lodging at an excellent price. We plan to do a separate letter with the information on Alaska in the coming weeks. Thank you for standing with us in this needed ministry. We encourage you to share the gospel with someone this week, seek opportunities to serve others, and remain faithful to the task Jesus left us to reach the world with His message.
