Thank you for your prayers for our family. Ashlyn did well through another semester at PCC. She is really enjoying the music classes and other opportunities she has there. We thank those that have given to help with her tuition. What a blessing to see God meet her financial needs. It has been great to have her home for a few weeks for Christmas. Sophia has also done well at her new school and has made some good friends. Continue to pray for our family's health. The last week has been difficult as we have been struggling with severe colds.

Pray also for our provincial and federal governments. Lately both governments have been introducing legislation that impact religion and churches in Canada. Churches have already been barred from renting public venues in Quebec, and the federal government is seeking to remove protections vital to religious freedom.
