Dear Praying Friends and Supporters;

In my Christmas preaching this year, I have not been able to get to what we consider “The Christmas Story”, of Joseph and Mary, shepherds and wisemen, for getting sidetracked with the story of Zacharias and Elisabeth. My thinking in regard to them has been the fact that they were “righteous before God”. They also were blameless in the statutes and ordinances of the Lord. In all of that, they still did not get the answer to prayer when they wanted concerning having children. God had to delay them well past the time that they would have thought to have gotten an answer so that He could work out His wonderful plan. Yet they continued righteous and blameless. Oh! That we might learn to put things in God’s hands, and just keep going on for His glory and honor!

We are still here in the US, having completed all of our regularly scheduled meetings of the year on the 21st of December. We had a wonderful day with Bro. Winkley and the folks at University Baptist Church in Atlanta, Georgia. We just took time to talk about the work in the Sunday school hour and then preached in the morning service. After a great meal we were able to preach the afternoon service in both Spanish and English for a combined service with University Baptist and Pastor Raúl Velasquez and La Iglesia Bautista Restauración. Afterwards Pastor Raúl asked if we would come and preach for them for their evening service. What a great blessing to be with both of these churches. We have 2 more meetings in January, then will be with our home church again before we head back.

The week after Christmas we were able to get together with all of our children and grandchildren for two days. It was a rowdy fun time. This was the first time all of us have gotten together in several years. It was such a great blessing to be able to love on the kids for a couple days and to try and spoil the grandkids as much as possible. We are so thankful to see how the Lord is working in each of their hearts. It was already difficult getting our last hugs in with Aaron before we head out, not knowing when we will see him again. We will do the same with the others here in the next week as we quickly advance to our 20th departure date.

In Honduras, the churches got together for a revival meeting in Ahuasluhpa, where Humer Ronas is starting a church. They had a great group of over 20 people coming in from the other churches, as well as most all of the village coming in for services at different times. The morning services had over 50 people with the night services filling the building and people all around the outside looking in. We were also able to supply food for a Christmas dinner at our church in Kaukira. There were



30 or more that came on Christmas morning for the service and a time of fellowship afterward. The folks were excited to be able to spend the time together and share the food with friends and family.

As we get to Honduras on the 20th and spend a few days in the city getting supplies, we will be making some major purchases for the men and the ministries. First, we have saved enough to get two 400 watt solar panels and one battery for Bro. Andy and the church in Puerto Lempira. We would like to get him another battery in the next couple months to give them a good amount of power. Secondly, we have already received \$1,700.00 toward the purchase of a motorcycle for Bro. Levis, as his is having constant problems and needing repair. Bro. Levis has been a huge blessing these last several months, filling in preaching in three different churches for us. The third purchase is supplies for a well for Bro. Humer and the church there. We would like to drill a well for him in the month of March, before the biggest part of dry season sets in.

While here in the US, we have been purchasing supplies to repair the fuel system on the Jeep. I have a secondary fuel pump and filter along with the original filter and high pressure pump and the fuel injectors. Hoping that we can get the system cleaned and sealed up to keep contamination out. I also discovered that I can order a higher grade of fuel now. With newer vehicles in the big cities they require a better grade of fuel. So we will be trying to get a barrel of that in to help as well. We have also sent in a starter for the tractor. I anticipate that the roads there will be in bad shape, and I am hoping they will let me work to level them out. I have a great box blade for leveling, but I could really use a grading blade with pivot and swivel, if someone has one lying around that they would let us ship. That would let me shape the road and make ditches on each side, rather than just leveling it out.

The Lord has also been working in my heart in regard to spiritual work as well. After Easter I have several people that we would like to begin doing classes with. Some are saved but need to grow spiritually. Others are not saved but have interest in studying the Bible. Our desire is to see Christians and members grow spiritually and for those lost to gain enough knowledge of the Scriptures that they can recognize and understand their need of salvation.

Sorry for another loong letter. Being in the US is dangerous with easily accessible resources and supplies, along with long drive times and meditation to think on the Lord and the work that He has for us. Now to get back and "get at it".

Thank you to each and every supporter who has sent us special Christmas offerings, we appreciate that so much! Thank you to the new churches that have taken us on for support, we praise the Lord for your willingness to partner with us. Most of all, thank you for your prayers in these past months, and also for your prayers in the coming days. We praise the Lord for so many new prayer partners being added while we have been in. We will be putting you to work in the coming months, Lord willing.
