Dear Partners and Praying Friends,

Thank you feels far too small for the gratitude we have toward each of you. Your prayers, encouragement, and faithful support are not just appreciated, they are deeply felt. There are many days on the road and in ministry when we are reminded that we do not serve alone. You stand with us, often quietly but consistently, and we are profoundly grateful for the way you uphold our family and the work God has entrusted to us.

Since our last prayer letter, so much has taken place. We completed our time in St. Vincent with the Ballinger family. December was full of ministry opportunities as I preached for Bro. Wilson Joseph on Sundays and assisted with Wednesday services, helped with the street meetings in Layou, and supported Bro. David during the Monday night Bible studies. There is a faithful group that attends each week, and new visitors continue to come. We are excited to see what God will do in and through this growing body of believers. While there, God also allowed us to take part in several Bible distributions where hundreds of Bibles were placed in the hands of the Vincy people. We also helped unload a 20 foot container containing 26,000 Bibles that arrived while we were there. We were honored to be a small part of what God is doing there during the five weeks we spent with them. While in the islands, we also had the joy of celebrating Dakota's 10th birthday, a sweet memory for our family.

As we move from place to place, we've come to realize that each missionary and field leaves a mark on our hearts. Every time we say goodbye, we leave a little piece of ourselves behind. It has deepened our prayer life for the missionaries we meet and strengthened friendships that go far beyond the time we spend together. Last year was truly a remarkable year for our family. We were able to assist two precious missionary families on their fields for extended periods, travel to three different countries, and cover many miles across the United States helping numerous missionaries and faithful Christians with projects and encouragement. Along the way, God also allowed us to raise more support while traveling, and we are humbled by His provision through you.

After returning from the islands, we spent Christmas and New Year's with family and celebrated Emmett's and Caleb's birthdays. We were in several deputation meetings before arriving in Alaska on January 31st. While in Anchorage, we experienced a small glimpse of what the Helms family does

regularly, picking up a vehicle for the Alaska trip (which was generously provided at no cost to us), shopping at Costco for a month's worth of groceries, and then traveling by ferry to Cordova on a seven-hour journey. It was both exhausting and exciting!

We've now been in Cordova for over a week. We have already helped with music and special singing at church, presented, and preached at the nursing home service. Beginning this Wednesday, I will start teaching evangelistic methods. I will begin with the ROPES course, a tool Bro. Matt Stahlman developed to show the Gospel from the fall of man to redemption. I truly enjoy teaching witnessing methods wherever we travel and will continue sharing different approaches each Wednesday night while we are here. On February 21st, we will assist the Helms family with their very first Vacation Bible School at Souls Harbor Baptist Church in Cordova. After four weeks of serving alongside them, we will stay and fill the pulpit while they take a short two-week trip to North Carolina to visit family.

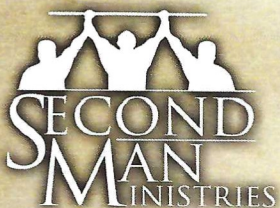
Once the Helms family returns, we will begin the next phase of our Alaska journey, prayerfully visiting other churches and missionaries. We are still finalizing those plans, but we are excited to see where God leads. As of now, we plan to remain in Alaska until the end of April or early May.

Looking ahead, our next major trip will be in June when we head to Maine to help the York family for the third year in a row. This is always a highlight of our year, and we greatly look forward to serving alongside this faithful family once again. We will update you on both our Alaska ministry and Maine plans in our next prayer letter.
