Dear Co-Labourers in Christ,

I pray you are rejoicing in the blessings of God. In Colossians 1:3 (KJV) it says, "We give thanks to God and the Father of our Lord Jesus Christ, praying always for you." We are thankful to you for your prayers for us too.

In our last letter we shared about shipping 16 drums of food and other supplies to Jamaica. It arrived, cleared customs without duty fees, and was given to churches in the hard hit area of Hurricane Melissa. The need didn't stop with food. There were altogether 22 Independent Baptist churches that were damaged from the storm.

We rejoice to share that \$30,000.00 came in to help with the rebuilding. As a result of this, I was able to go back to Jamaica January 15th-22nd to help some of these churches. The Lord blessed helping us to get these funds to Jamaica and exchanged into a little over three million Jamaican dollars. With this, we were able to help 8 churches with finances toward rebuilding and two pastors with help toward rebuilding their homes. I also felt led to help a pastor that worked with me right after we first went to Jamaica. His car had been broken down for 6 months, and he was having to walk everywhere, and his health is not the best. We are thankful that his car is now fixed which greatly helps as he ministers there. We have also been informed that one of the churches now has their building repaired to be able to have services in it.

On Saturday, while I was there, I fell and cracked a rib. I was still able to preach the services on Sunday in two different churches and again on Wednesday night, as well as doing the traveling to get to the churches we helped.

When I left for Jamaica I knew I was facing another back surgery to do a disc replacement. I had that surgery on February 2nd. It didn't go as well as planned. I could not move my legs, couldn't get out of bed, and the pain was really bad. My doctor kept me in the hospital, and on February 5th, he had to do a second surgery. Praise the Lord, I was able to move my legs, get out of the bed with help, and walk. I came home from the hospital on February 9th and am doing home therapy.

I am looking forward to getting back on the road before long. I am working on a video of the damage to the churches in Jamaica that I was able to help. There is still help needed in rebuilding these churches. If you would like to help, send it to Macedonia World Baptist Missions for Wesley Hutchens—Jamaica Hurricane Relief. I will make sure it gets to the right place.

Sister Hutchens had her first cataract surgery on January 12th, and all went well. Her second one was scheduled for the 26th but was cancelled due to the ice storm. Her next one is on February 23. Through all our challenges, God is still good all the time. We know He is in control. Please continue to pray for us. We want to thank you for your prayers and financial support. God bless you.
